STAKEHOLDER DISCUSSION: CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION CHALLENGES

On behalf of the Climate-KIC, EIT Health and EIT Food - three of the Knowledge and Innovation Communities (KICs) established by the European Institute for Innovation and Technology (EIT) – we would like to invite you a workshop to discuss recent research findings and co-create an innovation roadmap for addressing key climate change adaptation challenges. **The Climate Adaptation Innovation Roadmap (CAIR) Project** aims to identify and prioritise the key climate-health and climate-food adaptation challenges faced by EU Member States within the EIT Regional Innovation Scheme (RIS - see list below*) and identify priorities for innovation responses. The project will result in the production of a roadmap for climate change adaptation and innovation which will help shape a future KIC, and cross-KIC, calls for proposals where systemic innovation can play a more proactive role in preparing to meet climate adaptation challenges.

*The RIS is a structured programme to increase the innovation capacity in areas with modest or moderate innovation indices.
